### Noble Peer-to-Peer (P2P)

- Need assessment
  - Language acquisition
  - Standardized testing
  - Student interaction
- Program development based on need
- Funded by Ohio Department of Education 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers grant for three years at \$200,000 each year



### Program Focus

- > 50 students
  - Half Nepali/English Learners (EL)
  - Half native speakers
  - > K-5
- > Academic status
  - Native speakers "on the bubble" academically
  - Students referred by the Principal/staff with potential to benefit from the program



#### Program Activity

- Operation
  - Four days a week before and after school
  - > 7:30-8:45 AM and 3:15-6 PM
  - Breakfast, snack and dinner included
- Reading/Math support
- Arts and other enrichment
- Peer to peer interaction

#### Results in First Year

- > Results in first year of operation
  - Student scores
  - English Language acquisition
