Fan Conduct

Waterloo Fan Code of Conduct

Waterloo Local High School, in association with the Ohio High School Athletic Association promotes interscholastic events and sportsmanship. Sportsmanship is an essential part of any athletic competition and is expected from athletes, coaches, officials and fans. As a fan/spectator of Waterloo Local Schools we want you to be an example of positive encouragement while supporting our athletes, coaches and officials. Our behavior should be positive, respectful and encouraging of the athletes, coaches, officials and the game.

Failure to set an example of these athletic practices and/or ejection from an athletic contest will result in the following course of action:

First Offense – The spectator will schedule a meeting with the athletic director with resulting action that may include removal from the next two athletic contests of the same sport. A letter will be mailed by the athletic director and principal to the spectator informing him/her of dates of contests not permitted to attend following first ejection. The spectator will also receive a copy of the Board approved Fan Code of Conduct.

Second Offense – The spectator will be removed from all home athletic contests for the remainder of the season in which the infraction occurred. A letter will be mailed by the athletic director and principal to the spectator informing him/her of date of first ejection, date of second ejection and the decision to ban the spectator from remaining home contests for that season. In addition, the recipient will receive a copy of the Board adopted Fan Code of Conduct.

Third Offense – The spectator will not be permitted to attend any athletic contests, school events and/or activities for the remainder of the school year. A letter will be mailed home by the Office of the Superintendent informing the spectator of all three infractions, the dates they occurred and a copy of this Board approved Fan Code of Conduct.

Any athletic official, including but not limited to, contest officials, athletic director, assistant athletic director, principal or superintendent may uphold enforcement of an ejection.
