Directory Information

- Limited Directory Information
- State ex rel. School Choice Ohio, Inc. v. Cincinnati School District
- Springfield adopted limited directory information
- The form provided that student information could be subject to disclose only "for purposes approved by the Superintendent or his designee"

Directory Information, cont.

It identified two categories of approved purposes: (1) school-directed events or activities, such as yearbook publication or theater presentations, and (2) "educational, health, service, or other non-profit programs which may provide a benefit to the students of the District" that are directed in part or in full by third-party "community leaders, community organizations, and school-related organizations" approved by the superintendent as "partnering" organizations.




Directory Information, cont.


- Court held School Choice Ohio fits within the approved purposes
- Allowing the superintendent to make discretionary limitations after consent has been given does not limit the scope of parental consent.




















Regulation Small UAS - Commercial Register Label 216 y/o Pilot TSA tested Inspect

Regulation Small UAS - Commercial Line of Sight Daytime Not over people 100 mph 400 ft.

Regulation Certificate of Waiver (COA) • Exempts most small UAS requirements. • Pilot certification. • Registration.

Regulation Waivers and Authorizations • 81 Authorizations • 36 Waivers BUT • Rejected 854 Authorizations • 71 Waiver requests

Classroom Instruction

An art instructor at Bricker High School decides to teach a class on drone photography. Students may sign up for the class as an elective, but the instructor gets paid for his work. As part of the preparation for the class, the instructor buys his own drone and practices at home. Then, during the class, the instructor uses the drone to take multiple pictures, including of students, that are then used and manipulated by the students when back in class.

Fact Pattern #2



Student Club

Students start a drone club at Bricker High School. They hold their meetings on school grounds, after the school day, but enlist a teacher to help them with the club. The teacher does not get paid for her assistance and only occasionally helps the students navigate their drones.

Fact Pattern #3



School Business Use

The facilities director at Bricker High School decides to bring in her drone from home to inspect the roof of the school on a regular basis. She flies the drone where she can see it and makes sure to never fly it over students or when there are other aircraft in the area.

Non-sanctioned use on school grounds

The Principal at Bricker High School asks a student to fly their 4 lb. drone around the field to get video of a football game that can eventually be used by the school for promotional purposes. Nothing happens during the filming, but the pilot does fly over the crowd and players and takes photos and video of everyone from parents, to students, to instructors.
